Do you have a child? Are you pregnant? Nursing? Have children under the age of 5? If you said yes to any of these questions, you may be eligible for WIC to help you stretch your grocery budget.

WIC is a federally funded health and nutrition program that provides healthy foods, nutrition education, breastfeeding support and community referrals to eligible women, infants and children in your community. The income requirements are higher than many families are aware and offer extended hours of operation to help meet your family's needs.

In addition to our Auburn location, we have clinics in Cato and Moravia.

Mission: To promote sobriety and reduce recidivism by addressing the issues of alcohol, substance abuse and associated criminal behavior in our community, through the treatment and intensive supervision of qualified non-violent offenders. It affords participants an opportunity to confront and overcome their alcohol/drug addictions, thereby restoring dignity and self-esteem while reducing their rate of recidivism for criminal behavior.

Services: Treatment Courts are a unique partnership where the Court, prosecutors, defense attorneys and drug/alcohol treatment providers, work collaboratively toward a goal of assisting a criminal offender with the tools and support to enjoy an addiction free life. Participants are required to sign a contract and treatment is mandatory. Testing for compliance takes place in and out of court. Participants are supervised by the Court on a weekly basis and can expect to attend for at least a year. By graduation, participants are required to have gainful employment and/or be enrolled in an educational program.

Auburn Drug and Treatment Court is also a hub court. This allows eligible cases pending in Cayuga County to participate in Auburn Treatment Court. Treatment Courts have proven successful in communities throughout the state in rehabilitating offenders with drug and alcohol addictions.

Mission: ARC of Seneca Cayuga is a not-for-profit agency comprised of people dedicated to assisting and supporting individuals with disabilities, their families, and the community. ARC of Seneca Cayuga provides opportunities and choices for treatment, employment, education, recreation, and community living to assist individuals with disabilities in realizing a productive and fulfilling life.



Services: Autism Services

C.H.A.N.C.E.S. - Offers services to families who have a child with autism or an autism spectrum disorder. This program provides a parent support group coordinated by an LCSW-R. There are presently two groups: one for parents of teenagers and one for parents of children of any age. Offers educational opportunities for your child to try new skills at home or in the community and respite by direct support professionals. (Also, see CLINIC for more autism services)

Community Habilitation - Through this service, people build and retain the skills necessary to become more independent in some aspect of life. Services will take place in the home and community i.e., learning, cooking, homemaking skills, personal care, banking, purchasing groceries, using the community resources like the library or trying new hobbies like bowling, gardening etc. Hab services are designed to assist participants in acquiring, retaining and improving the self-help, socialization and adaptive skills necessary to reside successfully in home and community.

Community Services - Provides support to people with disabilities and their families. Cayuga County programs provide benefit management assistance, legal and educational advocacy, crisis assistance, individual habilitation services, family reimbursement, parent support, guardianship information, respite assistance, summer camp, family supports and services, fiscal management services, individual supports and services and self-directed services.

Consumer-Directed Personal Assistance (CDPA) - An in-home program which allows individuals to hire and train an attendant of their choice to assist them with their personal care. Staff assists individuals (or their representatives) in learning the process of hiring, training, supervising and scheduling their own assistants.

Respite - Provides small group social/recreational outings through hourly respite.

Transition Support - This program assists families with school-age children who are developmentally disabled or dually-diagnosed and who exhibit challenging behaviors which present a potential roadblock to their success. Staff work with students who may have difficulty with the transition from school to adult services. Services are coordinated with school, community and home with the goal of increasing the individual's skills. Clinicians also work with students 17 to 21 years old who may have difficulty with the transition from school to adult services. This Clinic Transition Support program would provide clinical assessment of the student in natural settings, education and support to parents and appropriate school personnel.

Day Programs:

Day Habilitation - Each Day Habilitation program is specifically designed to meet individual needs. Program sites are available that are suitable for the young and active, the elderly, and everything in between. People with all levels of need are welcome; each person's program is designed based on their abilities and preferences. On-site activities might include basic daily living skills, or include instruction in areas such as cooking, computer training, gardening and artistic expression. Community outings could include bowling, shopping, dining, or volunteering at many area not-for-profit organizations. Clinical services are available based on individual need and physician order. Seniors Program is a Retirement Day Hab without Walls, where every day is a community adventure, learning about all the activities that are available in the community.

Spotlight Studio - This theatrical program provides opportunities for people with disabilities through creative expression in acting, singing, dancing, art, stand-up comedy and playwriting. There are also behind-the-scene choices, such as costume making, set construction and technical production opportunities. There are usually two performances per year.

Transportation Services - are provided (to and from their homes) for all individuals enrolled in agency programs. Passenger safety is a primary concern; all vehicles are regularly maintained. Key staff is available Monday through Friday, 8:00am-4:00pm. The fleet include buses equipped with wheelchair lifts.

Clinic:

Karl D. Warner Clinic - Provides individuals with psychological assessment and diagnoses for OPWDD eligibility for services, including Autism Spectrum Disorders. The Article 16 clinic provides individuals with developmental disabilities convenient access to a wide variety of rehabilitative services, including psychiatry, occupational therapy, psychology, physical therapy, social work, nursing services, speech services, nutrition and rehabilitation counseling. These services are provided on a per-visit basis at various community locations. Intensive Clinical Services are available for those individuals identified. A clinical team provides these services in conjunction with programs, schools, residential staff or parents at home.

Intensive Behavioral Services (IBS) - An HCBS Waiver service for individuals residing in settings not certified by OPWDD and who present with substantial challenging behaviors that put them at imminent risk of placement in a more restrictive living environment. The focus is on clinical and behavioral treatment and intervention to prevent behaviors from reaching crisis level. Autism Intensive Services

- Services are provided by clinicians trained to provide services in the home and work with families to develop a person specific plan. Behaviorally based data is collected to assess the services success or alter the plan. Clinical staff coordinate with school and other program providers, for a consistent approach to presenting issues.

Vocational Services - are offered through Intensive and Extended Supported Employment; Individual and Group; Community Pre-vocational Services, and Pathway to Employment create a full range of opportunities. Each person is able to work at his or her optimal skill level while earning a paycheck and enjoying the satisfaction of meaningful work. The vocational programs are integrated with our Lifestyles personal enrichment program. Group and individual Supported Employment services, as well as intensive, job development and training and extended services, once they are successfully placed in a job.

Residential Services:

The residential program offers choices in living arrangements for adults who are over the age of 18 and who have a developmental disability. Options include ten Individual Residential Alternatives (IRA's) in Cayuga County. These houses are home to 4 or 5 people; all homes provide 24-hour supervision, guidance, and support from staff.

There are also five 24-hour supervised apartments in Cayuga County (for up to ten individuals). Supportive IRA's are also available in both counties for persons who are prepared for a more independent lifestyle and who do not require 24-hour supports. Planned respite is available at our Shevchenko IRA on weekends only, on a rotational basis.

Eligibility: Individuals must meet OPWDD eligibility for Waiver Services and must be Medicaid-eligible. Some vocational programs require Eligibility for VESID guidelines.

Services: Assessment/Evaluation - The agency provides comprehensive substance abuse evaluations for individuals who are in need of assessing their treatment needs. This service is also available to a variety of agencies/programs who require evaluations as part of their programming needs (Drug Court, courts, DDP, PINS, DWI, etc.)

Education Therapy Program - This service is focused on those who have experienced some level of problems in their lives as a direct result of their alcohol/substance abuse, over 14 weeks in duration. This is a non-intensive program which meets one time per week for 1 hour per session to 3 hours per session. There are AM and PM groups available.

Adult Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP Men's, Women's, Co-Ed) - This program is designed to meet the treatment needs of those individuals who are chemically dependent or have failed at the Education Therapy level. It is a medically supervised program. These groups meet two or three times per week in conjunction with Education Therapy for 1.5 hours per session.

Relapse Prevention Program - This program is designed to address the needs of those with previous treatment experience and relapse.

Young Adult Program - To meet the emerging treatment needs of adolescents between the ages of 12 and 18. The program consists of individual and group treatment designed to provide education on the symptoms and impact of abuse/chemical dependency along with the introduction of skills that will support positive change.

Medication Assisted Therapy - This program has two components available to C.H.A.D patients engaged in outpatient treatment:

Mental Health - Patients are assessed by a Board certified Physician when mental health issues present in early recovery and throughout treatment. Medication may be prescribed and monitored by regular visits with the physician throughout the course of Outpatient Treatment. Compliance with Outpatient Treatment recommendations is required to participate in this program.

Medication Therapy - Patients with a history of Opiate and or other addictions, may be assessed

by our Medical Staff to determine if they are appropriate for Medication Assisted Treatment. Frequency of medication/assessment visits is determined by the physician. Compliance with Outpatient Treatment recommendations is required to participate in this program.

Additional programming - C.H.A.D. offers additional programs for those in need of a specialized focus, or for those interested in furthering their progress in recovery. SOS Group (Suboxone & Opiate Support).

Additional treatment programs - offered include Dual-Recovery, co-Dependency, Men's Trauma, Women's Trauma and Spirituality.

Cayuga County Jail Program - The services are basic assessment and screening for substance abuse/dependency with the intent to facilitate the referral to the indicated level of care such as outpatient, inpatient or detoxification. Mission: To provide quality mental health services to Cayuga County residents. Mental health professionals work with individuals and their families/significant others supporting them with a person centered philosophy which is respectful, mutual and focused on recovery.

Services: **Clinic Treatment** - The Outpatient Clinic is licensed by the New York State Office of Mental Health and has professionally trained and licensed staff who provide treatment designed to reduce symptoms, and improve patient functioning. Services include assessment and treatment planning; individual, group, and family therapies; medication evaluation, therapy, and education; symptom management; and crisis intervention services.



Single Point of Access - SPOA was established to ensure that effective and comprehensive services are provided to individuals with mental health service needs. The Cayuga County Community Mental Health Center coordinates the County's Adult SPOA program. The SPOA committee consists of community service providers who meet regularly to coordinate and plan services for those individuals in need. Requests for SPOA can be made by completing the SPOA application and returning it to the SPOA Coordinator at the Mental Health Center or faxing to the SPOA Coordinator at (315) 253-1687. To obtain a form, contact the Coordinator by calling (315) 254-0341.

Care Management - The Care Management Program is for adults with complicated health needs that include multiple chronic health conditions and/or on-going psychiatric conditions. Care managers work with people to identify their needs and make a plan of care to meet these needs. The Care Manager will help the individual to manage this plan of care by accessing appropriate services in various systems of care, facilitate communication across health care providers, and assist the individual in following the plan of care. Community referrals for Adult Care Management can be made through SPOA.

Crisis Services - A crisis service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. During business hours, patients may walk in or call (315) 253-0341. After business hours, patients may call (315) 253-0341 and the call will be forwarded to Contact Community Services and calls will be screened by their trained crisis line staff. FAST was developed as a result of Cayuga County's System of Care participation and designed for families with children who have significant behavioral health needs around the following desired outcomes: Promoting wellness of children and youth across their lifespan; Multi-system sharing of resources and responsibilities; Providing an array of necessary and appropriate services and supports. In collaboration with families served, service providers and schools make referrals to FAST. FAST then contacts the family to explore options and initiate requested services. 

Mission: To use and promote peaceful dispute resolution processes throughout our communities through mediation, arbitration, conciliation, facilitation, negotiation, and training.

Services: Mediation services can be provided locally upon appointment. Mediation offers persons in conflict the opportunity to work with a mediator to discuss issues, explore solutions, and develop their own agreement outlining what will be done to resolve the dispute. Mediation is an alternative to the court process and is private, confidential, and voluntary. Mediators are not counselors and do not give advice. Our mediators have completed a thirty-five hour state-mandated training program and apprenticeship prior to mediating cases. Small/large group facilitation and fact-finding services, anger management sessions and training are provided upon request. Programs have a minimal fee or are offered on a sliding scale, Programs offered include:

Custody and Visitation Mediation - In cooperation with Family Court, persons who have child/children in common can mediate the terms of their custody and visitation agreement. An agreement reached in mediation becomes the court order following review by a family Court Judge.

Divorce Mediation/Arbitration - Divorcing couples can mediate all the terms of their divorce including custody and visitation issues. Couples who are divorcing or are already divorced can resolve issues pertaining to division of property by participating in our Divorce Arbitration Program.

Community Mediation Program - A program to address a wide range of issues ranging from claims of harassment/assault to landlord/tenant problems, interpersonal disputes with neighbors/other family members, small claims matters, consumer/merchant disputes, and neighborhood problems.

Mission: The NYS Mental Hygiene Law establishes Community Services Boards in every county and sets forth the composition and function of the Board for each county. In non-charter counties, such as Cayuga, the Board is a policy-making one and participates in and approves the plans which are submitted to each of the Mental Hygiene Agencies: Office of Mental Health, Office of Mental Retardation/ Developmental Disabilities, Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse. The CSB sets priorities for State Aid funding and recommends priorities for local funding to the County Legislature. The CSB also oversees the County Department of Mental Health and its contract agencies.

In general, CSBs act to assure that county citizens have affordable access to services and supports that are necessary to assist them in being productive, healthy, caring, and contributing members of the community. The CSBs ensure that service recipients and other interested parties play an integral part in the planning, development, and monitoring of the service system.

Services: The CSB, depending whether it is in a non-charter or charter county participates in planning, reviewing and overseeing all services to the mentally disabled within its geographic area and advising the Mental Health Dept. and the County Legislature on those services. Typical Board functions include identifying needs of persons with mental disabilities; promote and assist in the

development of local programs; establishment of system-wide priorities; develop short and long range goals; establishment of a local annual plan; research funding options and access funding; assure compliance to standards established by the State offices that provide certification and funding, as well as any locally developed standards.

The CSB is comprised of fifteen (15) persons from the community that have demonstrated an interest in the field of services for persons with mental disabilities. The CSB has three standing subcommittees Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Subcommittee, Mental Health Subcommittee and Subcommittee for People with Developmental Disabilities. These subcommittees are comprised of CSB members and other interested persons from the community. The subcommittees represent the community's interests in each area and serve to assist the Board.

All meetings are open to the Public and are generally held at the Mental Health Center, 146 North St., Auburn.

Volunteer Opportunities: Community residents who have an interest in services for the mentally disabled are welcome to attend meetings of the CSB and its three subcommittees on mental health, developmental disabilities, and alcoholism and substance abuse. Membership on the CSB and Subcommittees requires that a person be recommended to the County Legislature where appointments are made.

John Gavras Center, United Cerebral Palsy Association of Cayuga County, Inc.'s mission is to provide the highest quality educational, habilitative and therapeutic Services in Cayuga and surrounding counties to help children, families and individuals grow as independent, healthy and productive citizens.

Services: The E. John Gavras Center is an evaluation and treatment facility in Cayuga County providing educational, therapeutic, OPWDD, and respite care to individuals with special needs from birth through adult. The service area includes Cayuga, Seneca, Wayne, Onondaga and Tompkins Counties.

Preschool - The preschool offers programming for 3-5 year olds on a half day basis. Class time in both the morning and the afternoon runs for 2 1/2 hours.

Special Education Itinerant Teacher (SEIT) - Certified Special Education Teachers are available to support children in community and home settings. Itinerant teachers work with the staff at community preschools and with families to foster a better understanding of the child's strengths, needs, and learning style.

Therapy Services - The E John Gavras Center offers assessment and treatment of speech, language, swallowing and voice disorders serving individuals from birth through adulthood. Patients who utilize our Medicare approved site may need services due to a stroke, traumatic brain injury, Parkinson's Disease, ALS, aging or Multiple Sclerosis. Services are provided in acute and sub acute care settings. These services include a variety of developmental and physical disorders.

Group Day Habilitation - Group Day Habilitation is a Medicaid Waiver program operated under the auspices of OPWDD. The Group Day Habilitation services help individuals with daily life activities and in making rewarding connections and relationships within their communities.

Community Habilitation - A Medicaid Waiver program operated under OPWDD, the Community Habilitation services help individuals with daily life activities in their home environment and community. The services may be provided at any time of day; as long as similar Medicaid funded services (e.g. day habilitation services or state plan services) are not provided at the same time.

Individual Residential Alternatives - These are residential homes where 24 hour supervision is provided to consumers. They are designed to promote independence, integration inclusion, and allow individuals to be productive as possible within the community. The Center's focus is on maintaining the IRA as the consumer's home. Staff focuses on skill development and oversees the activities of a consumer's daily living and health needs.


