

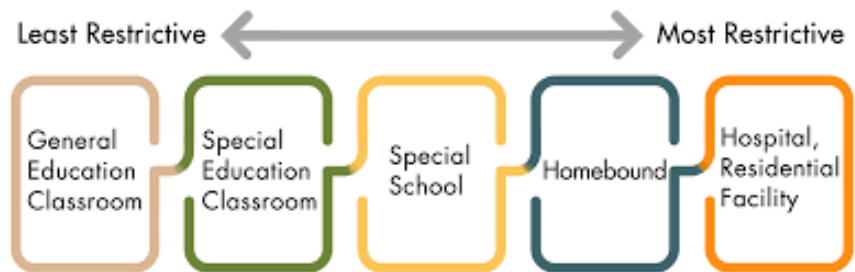

Continuum of Special Education Services

The Continuum of Services identifies different service delivery models to provide specially designed instruction to a student with a disability.

This continuum represents a range of educational placements in which an IEP can be implemented to meet the individual needs of students with disabilities. These placement options range from the least restrictive setting (i.e., general education classroom) to the most restrictive ones (e.g., residential facility).



Direct Consultant Teacher Services

Direct Consultant Teacher Services (CT) ensures specially designed instruction is provided to an individual student with a disability by a certified special education teacher to aid the student to benefit from the general education class instruction. It is not a pull out service. CT services are provided to adapt, as appropriate to the needs of an eligible student, the content, methodology, or delivery of instruction to support the student to successfully participate and progress in the general curriculum during regular instruction, so that he or she can meet the educational standards that apply to all students.

Integrated Co-Teaching Services

The purpose of Integrated Co-Teaching Services (ICT) is to provide specially designed instruction and academic instruction to a group of students with disabilities and nondisabled peers. The responsibility for planning, delivering and evaluating instruction for all students is shared by the general and special education teachers. Districts may choose to offer Integrated Co-teaching. It is not a mandatory service. This is the only continuum option that is **not** mandated to be available to all students with disabilities.
