## Welcome Back!

Though summer is winding down, the start of school is always a very exciting time, and I am delighted to welcome students and staff back for the 2018-19 school year.

As a school district, it is our responsibility to provide all of our students with instruction and experiences that will prepare them with the 21st Century skills necessary to be college and career ready, and be successful in our ever changing world. We are very excited to be launching a new instructional technology plan this school year in accordance with recently issued New York State requirements. In order to meet the needs of our students as outlined by these standards and expectations, it is necessary for the school district to implement a new special area structure for all elementary students. In the new special area rotation, elementary students will continue to receive general music and art instruction, as well as instruction that blends literacy, technology enrichment, and STREAM (Science Technology Research Engineering Art Music) instruction for a total of 90 days of special area learning. As part of the STREAM instruction, a K-6 Innovation Lab curriculum will be built into the special area rotation. Within the Innovation Lab, technology instruction will be used to enhance both the art and music curriculum through interdisciplinary design

projects, coding for music composition, and STREAM experiments that connect students with the books they are reading in class.

We have been working very hard on completing technology upgrades throughout the district that were outlined in our Smart Schools Investment Plan. These upgrades include the installation of Promethean ActivPanel's and the installation of a new, robust wireless network infrastructure. Significant progress has been made since the spring, and work will continue into the fall.

Throughout the school year, we are going to continue our attendance initiative in conjunction with New York State's "Every Student Present" campaign. You will continue to see posters, social media posts, literature, and more surrounding this because it is so important. When children miss school, it reduces their ability to learn and succeed.

School Spirit Fridays will continue throughout the school year. All students, staff, and community members are encouraged to wear our district colors, maroon and white, every Friday.

## **For Elementary Students!**

The district will continue to provide breakfast and lunch at no cost to all elementary students. This program, called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), allows all elementary students to obtain complete meals, free of charge, regardless of household income. This program was established by the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture to make it easier for children in low-income communities to receive meals at no charge. At the present time, this program is available to students in the elementary schools only. Students entering 7th grade will continue their free eligibility for the first 30 days of the school year. Please turn your applications in as soon as possible. After 30 days, only those students who meet eligibility requirements will continue to receive free meals.

There are no applications to complete for the CEP. As long as the student takes a complete ('reimbursable') meal, it will be free. If the student wishes to purchase a second meal, or only parts of a meal (i.e., milk), there will be a charge for that, so you may wish to keep or establish a prepaid meal account for your child.

The district contracts with Whitsons Culinary Group to provide meals for our students. The Food Service Director is Mike Herr. He can be reached at 315-255-8335.

# AUBURN ATHLETICS ... Spring Season 2018 Team Summary



**Boys Track & Field:** The Boys Track and Field team had a league record of 2-4, earning them 6<sup>th</sup> place in the SCAC Empire Division.

At the SCAC Empire Championship meet Joshua Cuddy was 4<sup>th</sup> in the 1,600M; the 4000M Relay team (C. Dotts/M. Lopez/Q. Bowman/T. Bowman) finished in 3<sup>rd</sup> place; Alex Haines finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 800M; Mike Hamilton finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Discus; Christian Dotts was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the High Jump; and Queshan Bowman won the long jump event.



**Girls Track & Field:** The Girls Track and Field team had a league record of 2-5, earning them 5<sup>th</sup> place in the SCAC Empire Division.

At the SCAC Empire Championship meet the 1,600M Relay team (M. Hamilton/G. Wagner/C. Picciano/M. Tillman) took 3<sup>rd</sup>; Kayleandra White took 2<sup>nd</sup> in the discus; Gabi Wagner took 3<sup>rd</sup> in the High Jump; and Kennedy Wilson took 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Pentathlon. Wagner tied the school record for High Jump at 5 feet. The team also earned the distinction of being a NYS Scholar Athlete team.



**Girls Golf:** The team finished with an 8-5 overall record, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in SCAC competition and 4<sup>th</sup> in the Section III Tournament. Lindsay May placed 1<sup>st</sup> in the Section III

Championship for the fourth consecutive year. The team also earned the distinction of being a NYS Scholar Athlete Team.



**Boys Lacrosse:** The team finished the season with a league record of 9-3 to finish 3<sup>rd</sup> in the SCAC Empire Division. The team had an overall record of 10-8 and qualified for the Section III

Tournament, beating Watertown 8-3 in the semi-finals. Auburn advanced to the final round of the tournament at CNS before losing to ESM 17-9. Senior Jake Morin was one of 22 from CNY who earned 2<sup>nd</sup> team All-State recognition.



**Boys Tennis:** The team's league record was 3-4, earning them 4<sup>th</sup> place in the SCAC Empire Division, and had an overall record of 6-7.

Scott Minnoe was the Class A Section III Champion, placing 1<sup>st</sup> in the Section III Tournament, with Willy Clark placing 2<sup>nd</sup>. The team also earned the distinction of being a NYS Scholar Athlete Team.



**Girls Lacrosse:** The team finished with a league record of 11-3, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in the SCAC Empire Division, and an overall record of 12-4. They qualified for the Section III Tournament, defeated

Central Square in the first round, and lost to F-M in the tournament finals held at SUNY Cortland.



**Baseball:** The team finished with a league record of 9-5, earning them 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the SCAC Empire Division.

They had an overall record of 9-8, qualified for the Section III Tournament, and lost their first game to Utica. The team also earned the distinction of being a NYS Scholar Athlete Team.



**Softball:** The team finished with an overall record of 13-8 and league record of 11-3. The girls finished second in the SCAC Empire Division, and qualified for the Section III Section Tournament.

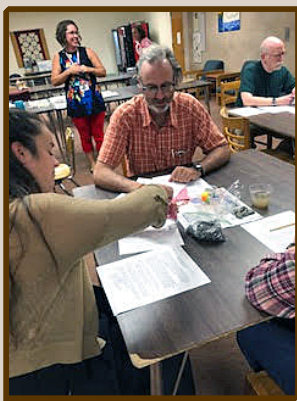
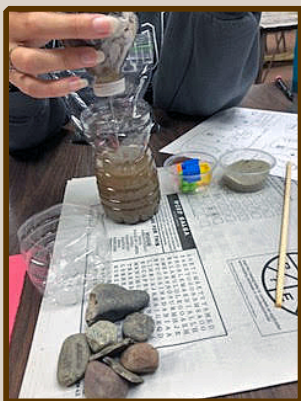

Students who are applying to colleges, please be aware that procedures for the confidentiality of student records within the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) have recently changed. FERPA permits school officials to disclose all education records, including disciplinary records, to another institution at which the student seeks or intends to enroll. This now also applies to post-secondary institutions (colleges), upon request.

## Four Reasons Auburn Celebrates Birthdays *Without Food*

### 1 We Promote Healthy Minds and Healthy Bodies



We are working to promote healthy minds and healthy bodies at Auburn. The research is clear - healthy kids learn better. To provide the best possible learning environment for children, schools must provide an environment that supports healthy behaviors. According to the Auburn Enlarged City School District Wellness Policy, students are to receive nutrition education that teaches the skills and attitudes they need to adopt healthy eating behaviors. The policy also states that the school district encourages parents, teachers, school administrators, support staff, and community members to serve as role models in practicing healthy eating and being physically active, both in school and at home. Decreasing the availability of "empty calorie" foods, foods that are high in fat, sugar and salt with little nutritional value (the type typically brought in for birthday celebrations), is just one strategy schools can use to promote wellness.

### 2 Instructional Time will be Preserved

Less instructional time will be lost with this policy. In the past, anywhere between 15 - 30 minutes of class time was used for each birthday party. At the conclusion of the party, very often the birthday child would then walk around the building offering the extra treats to teachers, usually accompanied by a friend or two. This resulted in several disruptions to other classes, and more instructional time lost for the birthday child and his/her friends. Auburn will still celebrate birthdays, however it will be done in a way that preserves as much instructional time as possible.

### 3 Every Child's Birthday will be Special

Every child's birthday will be celebrated. There are a few children in each of our classrooms that do not celebrate their birthday in school with treats brought in from home. This happens for a variety of reasons, some of which are unknown to us. We do know that some parents cannot afford to send in treats, some do not have transportation, and some cannot take time off from work. With this policy, no student will be excluded.

### 4 All Students will be Safe

Safety is a priority at Auburn. With this policy, students with food allergies, diabetes, or other food-related health issues will be safer, and will stop feeling excluded as they have on several occasions in the past. Even though teachers and parents took care to provide a safe snack for these children, these children do not enjoy being singled out 15 - 20 times per year. In addition, it could not be guaranteed that treats were sanitary. We have witnessed cupcakes being dropped on the way into school and being placed back on the tray, fingerprints and hair on cupcakes, students sneezing on an open container of cookies, etc. When it comes to students with food allergies, it is not just a matter of breaking out with hives, sneezing, and having a runny nose. Lives may be endangered. Even in classrooms where there was a strict policy in place regarding the types of food that could be brought into the classroom, not everyone followed the policy. Research has shown that 1/3 of students who have an allergic reaction at school did not previously know they had a life-threatening allergy.

### **Anonymous Alerts!**

The school district is pleased to announce our partnership with Anonymous Alerts®, the anti-bullying and safety reporting app and system. Starting in the 2018-2019 school year, this safety communications tool will be a new way for our students to quickly communicate anonymously with school officials and engage in anonymous 2-way communications to share more information about incidents. Types of concerns that may be reported include, but are not limited to, bullying, harassment, drug-related issues, fighting, weapons, threats, and more. The goal of this reporting system is to help maintain a safe school climate while giving students ample opportunity to securely communicate with school administrators without fear of retribution by their peers. The system will be monitored during school days between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

## THE DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY

The **Auburn Enlarged City School District** is committed to providing students with a school environment that promotes student health and wellness and reduces childhood obesity. The District Wellness Policy can be viewed on the district website. As part of the policy, the district shall:

- **ensure** that all foods and beverages available in school promote good nutrition, balance and reasonable portion sizes;
- **promote** the sale of non-food items or activities for school fundraisers;
- **require** non-food classroom celebrations; (see article on p. 4)
- **promote** the integration of physical activity in the classroom and encourage staff, families and community to participate in and model physical activity as a valuable part of daily life;
- **integrate** nutrition education that teaches the knowledge, skills and values needed to adopt healthy eating behaviors into the curriculum;
- **promote** fruits, vegetables, whole grain products, low fat dairy products, safe and healthy food preparation methods and health-enhancing nutrition practices;
- **inform** and update the public about the content, implementation and effectiveness of this policy.

## BACK-TO-SCHOOL CHECKLIST

### For Parents Who Have Students with a Health Concern:

- ➔ Make your child's health concern known to the school and school nurse.
- ➔ Introduce yourself and your child to the school nurse.
- ➔ Bring current signed healthcare provider orders.
- ➔ Together with the school nurse and other appropriate school officials, and family, develop an individualized healthcare plan (or other educational plans, as needed, e.g., 504, IEP).
- ➔ Give permission for the school nurse to communicate with your family's healthcare provider.
- ➔ Provide parent/guardian contact information and update the school with any changes.
- ➔ Ask if non-nurses will be providing care (for example, verify who will administer medication) and how these authorized individuals will be supervised.
- ➔ Confirm the school's disaster/emergency plan. Make sure your child's medication and/or medical devices (epinephrine auto-injectors, asthma inhalers, insulin, etc.) will be readily available in an emergency.

### For All Parents and Students:

- ➔ Make sure immunizations are up-to-date.
- ➔ Review hygiene tips to prevent the spread of infections.
- ➔ Establish a bedtime and wake-up time to ensure adequate and consistent sleep.
- ➔ Develop a routine for homework and after school activities.
- ➔ Eat breakfast each day at home or at school.
- ➔ Help make appropriate clothing choices (for example, wear comfortable and safe shoes).
- ➔ Keep an open line of communication with your child to ensure that he/she remains safe at school. If a concern arises (such as bullying), contact the appropriate school officials immediately.
- ➔ Get involved! Sign up for the parent organization (PTA/PTO), District Wellness Committee, District Parent Council, and mark events such as back-to-school night and parent/teacher meetings on your calendar.
- ➔ Ask about the school or district's wellness policy (for example, how does the school address nutrition, activity, stress and mental health concerns).



## STUDENT HEALTH EXAMINATIONS UPDATE

All students in Kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, as well as students wishing to participate in sports or become eligible for a working permit, and all new students to the district are mandated by New York State Education Law to have a current examination on record in the health office. The Health Staff encourages you to use your private health care provider for all required school health appraisals for better continuity of care. Should you choose to have a health appraisal done by the school physician or nurse practitioner in school, it will be scheduled at the convenience of the district.

Your child will be asked to disrobe to underclothing. While every effort is made to preserve dignity and privacy, most health offices are too small to provide the level of privacy your child may be used to in his or her private provider's office.

The physician conducts a mini-interview for history. These are age appropriate questions identified by the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics. Next, the physical screening examination is done. The exam includes a head-to-toe screening of all major organ systems. Please do not ask the school to conduct this exam unless you seek your own child's permission and understanding of the nature of the exam. Because school examinations, by law, are only screening exams and school providers may not diagnose or prescribe in a school setting, you will be advised of any areas of concern found on examination that require further evaluation by your own provider.

One last suggestion regarding private examinations. Most physicians recommend that you time annual exams around your child's birthday. It may take six to twelve weeks to schedule an appointment, especially over the summer. Please plan accordingly if you have these exams done privately. We understand that during this transition we will all need to be flexible, especially regarding sports participation. Our goal is to facilitate your child's ability to play in a chosen sport. All we ask is that if you have already had an exam done, that you please take a moment to call your private physician to get proof of the exam into the school nurse as soon as possible.

## STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES

The district's School Health Services program supports your student's academic success by promoting health in the school setting. One way that we provide care for your student is by performing the health screenings as mandated by the State of New York.

During this school year, the following screenings will be required or completed at school:

### Vision

- Distance acuity for all newly entering students and students in Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.
- Near vision acuity and color perception screening for all newly entering students.

### Hearing

- Hearing screening for all newly entering students and students in Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.

### Scoliosis

- Scoliosis (spinal curvature) screening for all students 8 to 16 years of age

### Health Appraisals

- A physical examination including Body Mass Index and Weight Status Category Information is required for all newly entering students and students in Pre-Kindergarten or Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11.

### Dental Certificates

- A dental certificate is requested for all newly entering students and students in Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11.

A letter will be sent home if there are any findings on the screening done at school that would cause concern or need medical follow-up. Please call the school's Health Office if you have any questions or concerns.

## PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, Effective July 1, 2001 requires all public and non-public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Auburn Enlarged City School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide application. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile read-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40 CFR 152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

## FEDERAL ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT (AHERA) NOTIFICATION

The Auburn Enlarged City School District, in accordance with Section 763.93 of the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), submitted Asbestos Management Plans to the New York State Education Department in 1989. Updated and reviewed annually, these plans contain reports of the accredited asbestos inspector and the reports of the accredited laboratory which analyzed the inspection samples that were taken.

The Management Plans also describe:

- Places in each school building where asbestos was identified
- Response actions taken to date including abatement of asbestos in elementary, middle, and high school boiler rooms, corridors, classrooms, crawl spaces, and storage areas.

Copies of the Management Plans are available in each of the principal's offices and in the District office. The plans may be reviewed during regular business hours (8:00 AM - 4:00 PM) daily, Monday through Friday. 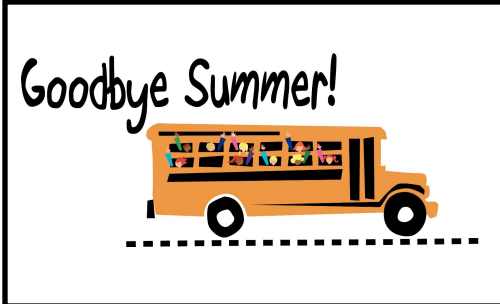

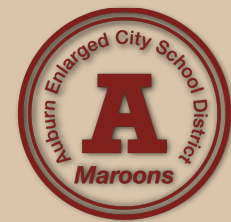


### Enhanced STAR Exemption for Senior Citizens

Senior property owners who already have a Basic STAR Exemption on their primary residence may be eligible for the Enhanced STAR Exemption when they are 65. You should apply when you are 64 so that, if you qualify, you may receive the exemption beginning the year that you turn 65. Auburn city residents should contact the Assessor's Office at City Hall on South Street (255-4125). Other Auburn (Aurelius, Throop, Owasco, Sennett, Fleming) and Cayuga County residents should contact their local assessor's office. The deadline for applications for Auburn city residents is February 1. Other Auburn and Cayuga County residents should check with their local assessor.

The Enhanced STAR program for senior citizens provides eligible seniors an exemption from school property taxes for owner-occupied, primary residences. To be eligible for this exemption, a property owner must be 65 years of age or older on December 31, 2018, with income not exceeding \$86,300.

STAR provides qualifying households with up to a \$66,800 exemption on the full value of their property. Qualifying residents owning a home with a full value of \$100,000 will recognize an estimated \$1,181 in Enhanced STAR tax savings in 2018-2019.
