# McKinney-Vento Quick Tip Series

## TIPS FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Act is a federal law that protects the educational rights of students in temporary housing.

It defines "homeless children and youths" as any student who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.

As a parent/guardian, **YOU HAVE RIGHTS** regarding the education of your child(ren).



If you are living in a temporary housing situation, your children have important educational rights. To be an advocate for your student, you should:

### **Know Your Rights**

- Choice of Schools: Your children have the right to stay enrolled in the school they most recently attended, to re-enroll in the school where you were last permanently housed, and to enroll in the local area where your family is temporarily living.
- **Immediate Enrollment**: Your children are entitled to immediately enroll in school, even if you do not have ANY paperwork for them, including immunization forms, guardianship papers, birth certificates, and proof of address.
- **Transportation**: Your children have the right to transportation to/from the school they last attended or were last permanently housed. They may also be entitled to receive transportation to/from the local school if other students in the area receive it.
- Free Meals and Title I Services: Your children are entitled to receive free meals at their school, without filling out any paperwork regarding your family's finances. They are also eligible to for all Title I services and programs.
- **McKinney-Vento Liaison**: Every school district must have a McKinney-Vento liaison who is available to help you enroll your child in school and connect you and your family with services.

#### **Ask the Right Questions**

- Who is the local McKinney-Vento liaison? How can I contact her or him?
- What transportation is available for my child? Who can help me set it up?
- Who can help set up free meals for my child?
- What if my child needs special education or English Language Learning (ELL) services?

## **Keep Track of Important Documents**

 Although not necessary for your child's immediate enrollment in school, keeping track of important documents like immunization records, birth certificates and individualized education programs (IEPs) will be helpful.

## **Know Who Can Help?**
