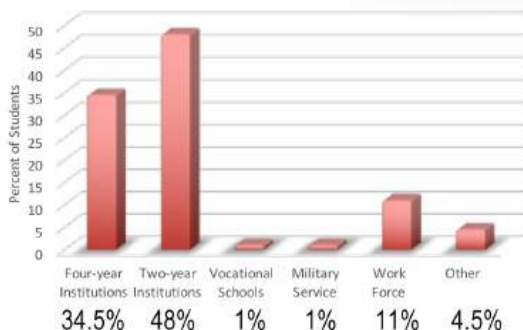

Grading Policy: A traditional numerical grading system is used with a minimum passing grade of 65%.

Full Year Courses: 75%=average of the 6 marking periods and 25%=final exam.

Semester Courses: 75%=average of the 3 marking periods and 25%=final exam.

** Some courses utilize portfolio assessment in the place of a final exam.**

GPA/Rank in Class: Grade point average and rank are computed after the 6th Semester. Both GPA and rank in class are weighted. When calculating rank, the weighting formula adds 5% to the final average in E, AP & college credit classes.

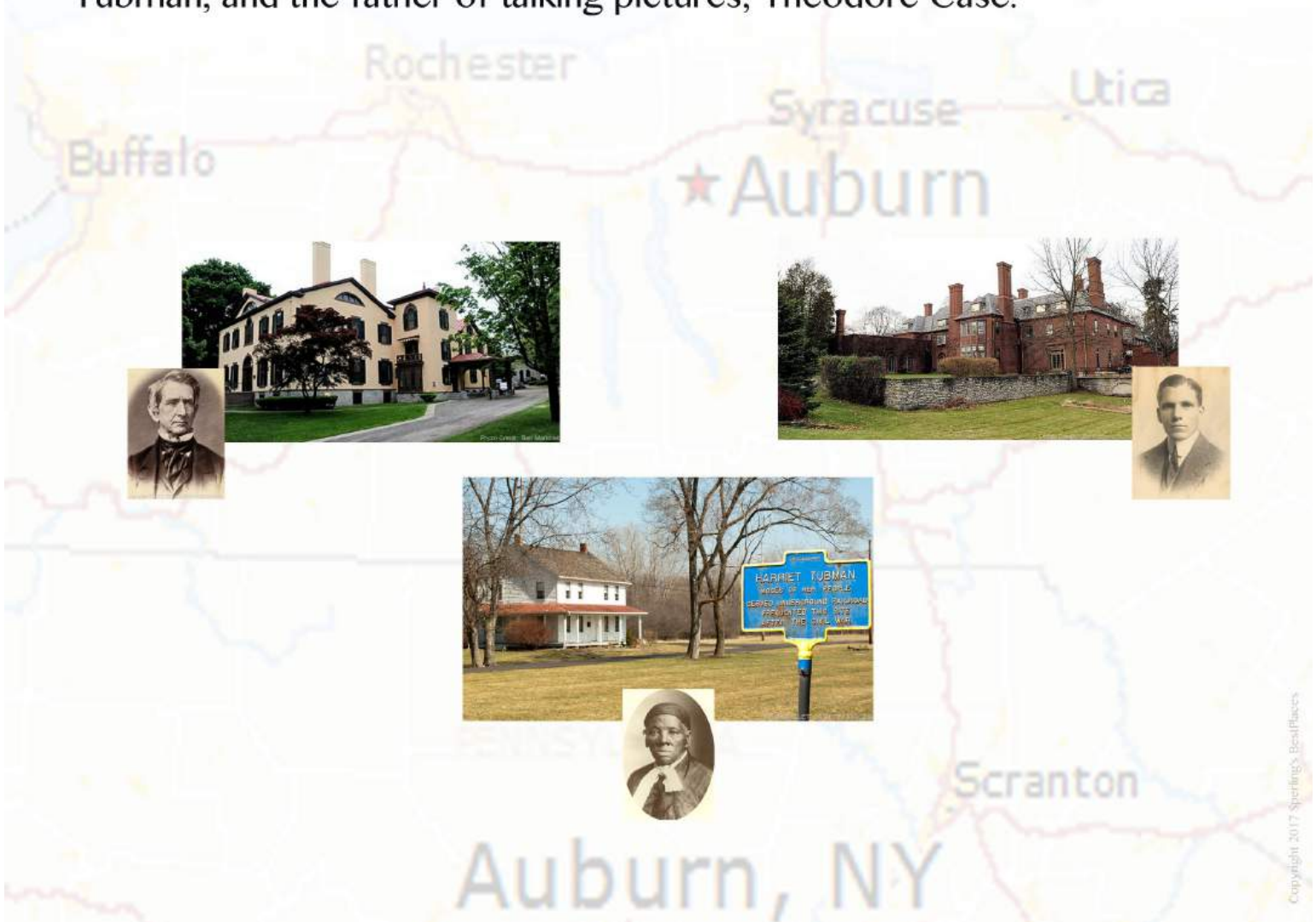


COMMUNITY
