Amy passed out the current family engagement plan which is outdated, it is from 2015-2020. Time was given for people to review the old plan. The plan had six standards for family engagement which were based on the 2008 National PTA Standards.	
The standards in the 2015 Plan were: 1. Communicating 2. Parenting 3. Student Learning 4. Volunteering 5. School Decision Making and Advocacy 6. Collaborating with Community	
Those PTA standards have been revised, and a slide was shown with the updated standards.

The current district plans will be looked at to consider pulling information from them. Those plans are:

There was discussion about whether to work on this new plan in one meeting or to work on a piece of the plan at each meeting. The general consensus was that it would encourage people to participate if there were still additional topics each month.

Additional discussion was that the wording of the invitation to participate in DPC should be reworded to encourage more participation. It was also discussed that there are not multiple reminders for DPC as opposed to other district events. The discussion continued about how topics are chosen and if a survey can be sent. It was asked if principals were making personal connections to get representation for their schools from meetings. Teachers should also be encouraged to tell their parents about it. It was brought up that perhaps the name should be changed to "District Parent Conversations". There was a discussion about that the location should change monthly.





The decision was made to break up the family engagement plan into pieces. "Taking the show on road" to different schools was postponed until next month.

Work period for the next meeting is how to break up the family engagement plan pieces and to create a survey to be sent out to parents to get relevant topics and to discuss DPC rebranding.
